IN A WORLD WHERE YOU CAN BE ANYTHING... -by Misha

Some people find that the beginning of a new year offers an opportunity for a fresh start. Making new year's resolutions is common – have you made any this year? You may be a better person than me; I find that my fresh start lasts about a week or so...

I wonder, were you among those who watched the wonderful short film this Christmas "The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse" based on the illustrated book by Charlie Mackesy about friendship and a boy's search for home? I loved the book. The film was lovely. At one point during this moving story, the mole asks the boy: "What do you want to be when you grow up?". The boy, sat on a branch with his new friend, the mole, answers: "Kind. I want to be kind." Not a fireman, a nurse, or a dancer, but "kind".

Kindness is such a powerful force, especially at those times when we feel we have run out of resources and feel weak and challenged. At those times, kindness can make us feel seen and valued again, and we often remember those people who have been especially kind to us for many years to come, warming ourselves at the glow of their kindness as we remember that time, even decades later.

There's an old joke which goes a little like this: "Dear God. Thank you that so far today, I have been kind and patient and loving. However, in a moment, I will have to get up... Then I'll really need some help!" It may be easy enough to be kind until life's demands and disappointments come to test our patience. I am only too aware of the limits of my own resolve at times. Sooner or later, my best intentions have to get out of bed and the rubber has to hit the road.

When I am faced with my own shortcomings, I find great comfort in knowing that God looks at me with compassion, always ready to forgive and set me back on my feet. Left to myself, I would never grow up to be kind. If we ask, slowly and gradually, God will help us 'grow up' to be more like Jesus. These words comfort me. "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end, they are new every morning. Great is his faithfulness." (Lam. 3:22-23) Even when my resolve is weak, God's kindness never fails. It is from that place that I might hope to love myself and others, too.
