A pair of them with juveniles were on the roof of the buildings at the Baptist College in Cardiff where I have stayed for the past couple of days on a study break. I am sure there are scientists out there who are able to tell us what these winged creatures were trying to say to each other (and everyone else), but to my untrained ears, it just sounded like SQUAWK, SQUAWK, WHINGE! It seemed to me that they didn't have much to say and yet were trying to say it again and again with great conviction.

Jesus once told his disciples that it's not saying things over and over, or loudly, in many different ways, or in the town square that made God listen. "Don't go on and on", he said, "like those who don't know God. God already knows what you need, before you ask". Prayer is about trust and relationship and, mysteriously, about working together with God in bringing about a better world.

Most times, prayer is about spending time with God in secret and in quiet, to tune into what God is like and what he dreams about for this world, which he loves so much. Prayer is also to discover, in the light of God's presence with us, what we are called to be and what we truly need. Then we can pray short prayers, alone or together with others, which line up with God's big heart for us.

I don't know if you ever think of God as a dreamer? As someone with desires and plans? A bit like a wonderfully exited parent or grandparent who wants a young person to do really well when they start school or go into big school, only wanting what is truly good for everyone and for the whole world. Peace with justice.

"I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope". (NLT) God spoke these words at a time when his people would still have to stay in exile for years, so he also told them this: "Work for the peace and prosperity of the city where I sent you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, for its welfare will determine your welfare". We all inhabit communities together, live in this place together and whether we pray or not, I hope we can wish each other well. God does, and Jesus showed us what that looks like.

Each Sunday a small group of people from across the country meet on Zoom for a service with communion once a month.

Fun and playful 'Sunday School' at 10am on the 2nd and last Sundays of the month at the chapel. All children welcome to join us.

We play games, dress up and dramatize one of the great stories from the Bible. We also sing songs with actions, do a bit of craft and write our own prayers. We want things to be fun, engaging, and practical, so sometimes, we will go outside too. We really hope your child or grandchild would want to join us. We currently have 3-4 children joining our small group but we really want more friends!

The next dates will be 13th and 27th August and 10th September at 10am in the chapel – come in through the vestry door.

On the **13**th **of August**, something really special is going to happen! We will join the rest of the church at the river to experience a baptism together. Someone is going to get very wet. What does "baptism" mean?

Ragdolls and Jumping Jacks! On the **27**th **of August**, we explore how the church is sort of like a body with arms, legs, eyes and ears... We have different talents and all of us are needed for the church to work well. What's your talent? Can we make a body out of different parts? What's the secret ingredient that will make it work?

September 10th is Harvest at Pentref and we're going to think about how the church can be decorated to celebrate. We have an evening service at 5PM too – can you manage Spotlight TWICE in a day? There will be a bit of supper at least, so you won't go hungry!

It's always better with friends, so if you know of a primary school aged child who would like to come, please bring them along so they can see whether they like it.

Children need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.
