I was quite moved, and as someone beside me remarked: "I don't think Newbridge has ever had so many people in it!" It was lovely to see the whole community enjoying the day together. Just wow.

A few weeks ago, at the chapel we had a small-scale version of the same experience – that people turned up from all over for the barbecue and added their own special vibe to the evening. Young and old, chapel and certainly-not-chapel folk, children playing and helping out, friends pitching in to get things done at the last minute, stories and experiences told, all different, yet sharing food and time together... Thank you too to those who came and those who helped. It is often a bit of organised chaos, and it is wonderful. The next shared meal is on the 12<sup>th</sup> of July.

There are many stories about weddings, parties, and feasts with food among the parables that Jesus told, and Jesus himself did not say no to a dinner invitation. In fact, he often got in trouble for having his tea with 'the wrong crowd'. Perhaps that's why my heart is so happy when people get together and perhaps that's why Jesus says that the kingdom of God is like a big dinner party. God invites not only the rich, but also the poor, not only the pretty parts of us, but also those things we would rather hide. In that welcome, we are transformed as we realise that we too belong in the picture, called to much more than we could ever imagine.
