#### Alan writes:

Finding my faith again after moving to Newbridge found me wanting to enter into our local chapel to start a re-connection with God.

We all have trepidation whenever we do something new or unfamiliar, however after walking up to the big red doors and around the side of the chapel, my hand made contact with the Suffolk door latch, and I was in through the door into a light airy space surrounded by fellow worshippers.

I joined the service and throughout felt comfortable, During my visit, there was complete empathy, genuine warmth and a feeling of care. No one judged me or asked awkward questions, everyone welcomed me, and I left with a feeling that both those present and God had wrapped their arms and hands around me in a loving and warm way just like holding a cup of warm soup or coffee.

My journey started there that day and, like being on a railway, I bought a ticket to an on-going destination. I am still on that train and those initial feelings haven't changed.

Fun and playful 'Sunday School' at 10am on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and last Sundays of the month at the chapel. All children welcome to join us.

We play games, dress up and dramatize one of the great stories from the Bible. We also sing songs with actions, do a bit of craft and write our own prayers. We want things to be fun, engaging, and practical, so sometimes, we will go outside too. We really hope your child or grandchild would want to join us. We currently have 3-4 children joining our small group and we really want more friends!

The next dates will be: 10<sup>th</sup> September, 24<sup>th</sup> September, and 8<sup>th</sup> October at 10am in the chapel – come in through the vestry door.

**September 10**th is Harvest Day at Pentref and we're going to think about how the church can be decorated to celebrate. We have an evening service at 5PM too – can you manage Spotlight TWICE in a day? There will be a bit of supper at least, so you won't go hungry!

On the **24**<sup>th</sup> **of September**, we talk about having enough, but not too much, and how God looks after us in all sorts of ways. Have you ever heard about "manna"? What is it?

Are the leaves falling yet? What can we learn from what Jesus says about vines, tree, branches, and fruit? On the **8**<sup>th</sup> **of October**, we will do a bit of craft using leaves that we find – and talk about being 'plugged in' to God's power supply.

It's always better with friends, so if you know of a primary school aged child who would like to come, please bring them along so they can see whether they like it.

Children need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.
