"A difficulty for our shut-in members, and still more for those who are being 'shielded', is a



feeling of uselessness. Their characteristic reaction in time of trouble was to bake a cake and take it round, or pop round to see those in trouble or need, take some fruit, cook a meal..... give them a hug.... take them shopping.... And now such things cannot be done, without getting someone to help, which is difficult too.

The change from being a provider, to being one who is provided for, needs grace."
