#### NEWBRIDGE CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SWITCH ON.

The Christmas season began in Newbridge with the Christmas Lights Switch On taking place early evening of Friday December 10<sup>th</sup>, outside The Golden Lion. There was Carol Singing led by some members of the Llandrindod Wells Theatre Company. The highlight for the children was a special visit from Father Christmas. Fortunately, it was a cold, but dry evening for the youngsters to queue to see him. There was also hot chocolate, hot toffee apple cider, and hot dogs and burgers, available for the sizeable crowd to enjoy. It should be said that all the outside Christmas lights and decorations in the village were excellent, including those outside the New Inn on the adjacent village green, a number of housing estates, and by individual residents in the village.

#### CAROLS BY CANDLELIGHT.

Newbridge Baptist Chapel held its annual Carols by Candlelight service on Sunday December 12<sup>th</sup> in the early evening. Gathering at Pentref were members and friends of the two local churches, together with local residents. Those attending included the Rev Peter Letson, who read one of the lessons, and his wife Clare of All Saints Church. Also present were Rev Paul Tarling and his wife Louise, who also read one of the lessons, from Holy Trinity Church, Llandrindod Wells. There were carols, readings, prayers, and a message from Rev Steve Wallis, Minister of Pentref, who appropriately with the church lit by candles, spoke about the light of the world taking over from complete darkness.

#### CAROLS ON THE GREEN.

This pre-Christmas joint service between All Saints Church and the Pentref Baptists took place on the afternoon of December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Christmas service of carols, prayers, readings, and congregation participation, culminated with Communion. There was a short appropriate sermon by the Rev Peter Letson, explaining the significance of the Christingle. The bible readings were given by Mrs. Clare Letson.

#### BOXING DAY SUNDAY.

The normal Sunday morning service was held at Pentref Baptist Chapel on Boxing Day morning, led by Rev Steve Wallis, who re-lit the candles on the Advent Ring as he spoke about lighting the way to Jesus.
