The Newbridge-On-Wye Newsletter Pentref Baptist Church October 2023 And breathe... September has been full of travel with lots of conferences and training events scheduled. One of them took me to Durham, where I found myself in a short lunchtime communion service at the cathedral, surrounded by locals and other travellers. A gentleman wasn't sure how communion was going to happen and turned to me for a bit of advice – I must have looked 'vicarish'. I offered him a few hints, but truth be told, I wasn't entirely sure either. I sometimes visit churches quite different from this little local Baptist church because it keeps me aware of how hard it can be to 'try church' or be new to how it's all done! Please know that you are always welcome – there is space and time for you too at Pentref.

One thing which I found really moving in Durham Cathedral was that all the used tealights people had lit in the cathedral had been gathered in a bowl which was put on the alter as the priest prayed and offered to God "all these silent prayers". All the prayers we simply sigh or shout, even if we aren't always aware that it is prayer or quite sure to whom we are addressing them, the prayers we *cannot* speak... There is something about prayer which is almost like breathing – it's built in and just happens.

At the same time, I find it really helpful to be part of a community of people who try to listen to God together. Strange as it might sound, prayer isn't simply me talking and asking for things. God does speak to us in various ways too. Through the Bible of course, complex as it is (start with Mark's Gospel, I'd say). But prayers are answered directly too and sometimes a nudge may be divinely inspired. I can't count the times when a sudden urge to approach a stranger in the street or at a table in a café, led me to someone with a real need for a chat about something deeply troubling them, when a little bit of my time proved to make a real difference. People's honesty, pain, and trust, make me feel extremely privileged to be allowed to listen and to help others listen for God in the midst of all that is happening in their lives. I too have people who help me listen when I need a little help. Perhaps all this shows is that we all need a listening ear?

Well, I am sure some of these are a nudge from God because most of the time, our answers to prayer come through people not miraculous interventions. Even if you wouldn't use that language though, I have seen how attentive people really brighten someone's day with a small 'random act of kindness'. The recipient of the free coffee, the envelope through the door, the contribution towards a school trip for the kids they can't afford, often doesn't know who has done them a good turn, but the idea then is to 'pay it forward' rather than try to pay it back. Go and bless someone else. Can we make the world a kinder place together? Why not try? **-Misha**






WELCOME LANCE
