An angel visiting a young woman in a remote village in the far corner of a small country on the edge of the Roman empire. A man, not sure what to make of his fiancée's growing bump, with divine dreams that this has not come about the way the rumours would have it. A dark night field lit up by the shimmer and song of myriad angels. Travelling wise men, horrible human atrocities, and in the midst of it all, a newborn baby, snug and sort-of-safe in a feeding trough, wrapped in strips of linen, brand new, and yet, present since before the beginning of all things. A story full of wonder, full of awe.

Perhaps you'd think that because I am a minister, this all makes perfect sense to me, but to be honest, there's loads in the Christmas story and in the rest of the story about God and God's people described in the Bible which either puzzles me, delights me, challenges me, or simply make me go: "Huh?" – sometimes all of them at the same time. There is a certain way in which God seems to enjoy doing things in the *least* likely way sometimes. I think becoming a little baby in a hostile world, dependent on the care and nurturing of a young first-time mother is perhaps one of the clearest examples of this. Another clear example is what happened on the cross: Jesus deciding to go all the way into the very darkest of darkness to blow up evil from the inside by the power of love. You might wonder, as I sometimes do, why did an all-powerful God decide to do things like that? Why not just fix things (there is enough to fix)? Why not just snap a few divine fingers and call the world (and us all) to order? Why *that* way??

I think free will has got a lot to do with it. Or to put it another way: Love is only love if it is given freely. It may require effort. It may demand sacrifice. But unless you are free to say no, your yes does not really count much either. We were made so that our love can be genuine. Not always perfect, but at least real. And it seems to me that the main way God works in this world is through people: People giving generously to relief agencies. Doctors devoting their lives to caring for those no one else values. Grandparents sharing stories with the next generation. Teachers. Bin men. Even unlikely folk like you and me, sometimes in ways we barely realise.

Christmas, when we can unearth it from beneath gift wrap and unrealistic expectations, is exactly such an opportunity to choose to love and to let the words the angels sang be true again in our day: "*Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people on whom God's favour rests*!" Choosing love is not always easy; Jesus' own life showed as much. Yet he came to us, as a gift from God, and invites us all to stop for just a moment to marvel at the mystery: God came to live among us to show us real love.

WINDOW ON THE WORLD

A taster session of 'Window of on the World', a series of talks, took place on the last Wednesday of October. Rev Ifor Williams of Erwood spoke about his work for the last 20 years with the Farming Community Network, the "Samaritans" for farmers. In order to illustrate their work without mentioning individual cases, Ifor drew a parallel to his own farming family history, touching on topics such as the lonely life of a farmer, health conditions and mental health, marriage relationships, weather, TB, and the complications of succession. Ifor works part-time milking and looking after the welfare of young stock on a neighbouring farm and was happy to answer questions from the audience. Rev Misha Pedersen thanked him at the conclusion of his very enlightening talk and followed with a prayer for the work of the Farming Community Network. Afterwards, everyone enjoyed a cup of tea and a chat. The next talk will be in late January.

Christmas Eve, the **24th of December**: How do we make sure we have room for Jesus? We help each other decorate the last bits in the chapel and see if the donkey, the camel and the angels are ready for Jesus to arrive.

14th January: Does God speak to children? What does the voice of God sound like? What would you do if you heard it?

It's always better with friends, so if you know of a primary school aged child who would like to come, please bring them along so they can see whether they like it.

Children need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.
