

The Road to Emmaus - by Phyllis Miller

The Newbridge-On-Wye Newsletter Pentref Baptist Church April 2024 The internet tells me that in 1914, an 18-year-old Newport lad snuck onboard Sir Ernest Shackleton's ship "Endurance". Stowaway Perce Blackborow hid in a locker until it was too late for the ship to turn around, at which point he emerged. He was, allegedly, told by Shackleton himself that when supplies ran out, clandestine travellers would be eaten first, to which he is supposed to have replied: They would get more meat off you, Sir! He was put to work in the kitchen and survived the experience (minus a few toes) when the ship was crushed in pack ice near Antarctica.

The Bible tells me that shortly after Jesus' tomb was found empty, two people were walking towards their home village, about as far from Jerusalem as Beulah is from Newbridge. The village was called Emmaus. The two travellers, possibly Mr and Mrs Cleopas, were talking about all that had happened when a stranger caught up with them and began asking what they were talking about. They told him, not knowing that the person who was walking along with them was in fact Jesus: "Don't you know? Are you the only one who hasn't heard??" It's a bit of an "He's behind you"-moment, as of course, Jesus knows better than anyone what had happened. After all, it was he who was crucified and his tomb that was found empty. Jesus, still incognito, explains what the old prophecies had said and then ends up going into the house with them as it's getting dark. There, he blesses and breaks the bread, as an echo of that last supper from just a few days prior where he said: "This is my body". I suppose it really was the clandestine traveller who was sacrificed first. Only as the bread sits broken in Jesus' hands do they recognise him, saying "Well, it really did seem like our hearts were burning within us when he explained Scripture to us, didn't it?". Jesus vanishes and these two followers of Jesus run back to Newbridge umm Jerusalem, to tell the other disciples all they've seen, only to find, they've seen him too. You can see a painting of these three walkers on the front page, created by Phyllis Miller.

The story of the Emmaus journey reminds me of how, whether we are aware of it or not, Jesus travels with us through life. God is always there, offering us Godself as a gift. Always there, whispering to us something of God's grace, goodness, and longing to be with us. Sometimes, it's almost as if we wake up and realise that God was there all along.

I pray for you that you would have such an experience and that you will find in it echoes of God's love which loves, and loves, and never quits. And I pray that in this community, whatever our faith and convictions, we would be good travelling companions for each other: Caring, calming, creating, communicating, crossing borders and bother to meet in new places. **Misha**



## OPEN DOORS PRAYER GROUP

There is a meeting of the "Open Doors" prayer group on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April at 2:30 in the St Francis Centre at Holy Trinity to pray for persecuted Christians and watch videos from around the world. You are very welcome to join them for prayers and refreshments if you would like.

Open Doors create a list each year of the places around the world where it is most dangerous to be a Christian. This "World Watch List" currently has North Korea, Somalia, Libya, Eritrea, and the Yemen at the top, followed by Nigeria, Pakistan, Sudan, Iran, and Afghanistan. Freedom of speech and religion are hard to come by in these and many other places. The videos shown at the group gatherings contain a lot of hope as well as things that are challenging.

One recent prayer video explores the situation in Cameroon where Boko Haram tries to destabilise Christian communities by killing the breadwinners in the family, leaving widows traumatised and vulnerable. Work is ongoing to provide support groups and improve literacy where women and girls are now often not able to get an education.
