

All of a sudden, it seems, spring is here. The trees are filling in with more and more green, the bluebells are on tippy-toe ready to start their sweet-smelling chiming and the birds are getting up earlier and earlier each day, singing their songs at me as if I am already late before 6 in the morning! I suppose there is always something to do, in the garden, at the chapel, on the computer... But fortunately, there are times of rest too. Hopefully, for those who have been lambing, a little breather will be possible soon.

Remember the epic story about how God wanted to make a world with people in it. At the end of all God's creating, God rested. Everything was finished. The last little bit of dust sprinkled on the butterfly's wings, the Fibonacci sequence put in the sunflower and the Romanesco, the rivers set to run... Then, God walked in the garden with human beings created for relationship and enjoyment, talking face to face and heart to heart, spending time together. When you potter around in the garden, walk the dog, fight the cobwebs, or light the barbecue, I suspect you don't think about that, but we were made to be together and to be connected to God, saying to God what it seems the birds say: "Alive, alive, alive, thank you, thank you, thank you!" Despite the initial bliss, today birds fall to the ground, and not everyone has someone to share a meal with each day. Some of us feel a lot less alive than we once did, and some of us acutely miss someone who is no longer with us. Things aren't as they should be, and if we are honest, we realise that we aren't as we should be either. We can be selfish, impatient, cling to wrongs, get things muddled... In the midst of it all, God cares about our difficulties, deeply, intimately and continually. Sometimes, it's through the actions of other people who sit with us, phone us, or make life a place full of imagination and belonging, that we discover God's care. Occasionally, we know God's presence in more immediate ways, too.

Easter tells the story of a love so stubborn it would not quit, so strong it could not stay dead. A love, as seen in Jesus, which keeps reaching out to likely and unlikely folk, offering a transformed life, a place at the table, a meaningful future starting in the midst of pain, today. Something brand new was created on that Easter morning when Jesus walked into that garden in which the rolled-away stone landed. Like all good creation, it is still unfolding, but also finished, perfect, ready to live in. Jesus-in-a-body returned to God, but is always at work by his Spirit, calling, challenging, and changing people to co-create this new world with Him for all to enjoy, in carnivals, Christmas lights, after-school clubs, shared meals and smiles.

At All Saints:


At All Saints, there is a service on the 1st Sunday of the month at 11am, and you would be very welcome to join the next one on 5th May.

REFLECTIONS ON HOLY WEEK

Eleven of us met on Maundy Thursday evening to share a simple meal of bread, cheese, olives, grapes, and salad. As we sat around the table, we commented that it would have been very like this at the Last Supper, when Jesus shared the meal with his disciples before being betrayed by his friend Judas and arrested. We had a lovely time of fellowship, and the evening was concluded by sharing Communion together, as the disciples did with Jesus at the end of that meal in the upper room.

The following evening, Good Friday, saw eight of us gathered around 16 lit candles for a Tenebrae service (light into darkness). It was very moving as in turn we read the account of the passion and crucifixion of Jesus from the Gospel of John. After each reading, one of the candles was extinguished, until at the end we were in complete darkness. We all left in silence as we contemplated the words of the passage and imagined what it must have been like for Jesus and his friends and family.

On Easter Sunday we were greeted by the delicious smell of bacon and fresh coffee as we arrived half an hour earlier than usual at the chapel hall.

We enjoyed bacon rolls, fruit, and yoghurt before the start of the service. Then we listened to the story of the women who went to the tomb but found it empty! They told the other disciples who also ran to the empty tomb, and Mary Magdalene found she was talking to the risen Jesus himself in the garden when he called her by name: "Mary".

Later in the afternoon, 10 children and several adults enjoyed our Easter Egg hunt



and made chickens, sheep and garden tombs at the craft tables provided.

There is a meeting of the "Open Doors" prayer group on the 28th of May at 2:30 in the St Francis Centre at Holy Trinity to pray for persecuted Christians and watch video updates. You are very welcome to join them.

In Bangladesh, a Sunday school was recently stormed by very angry women belonging to an extremist Islamist political party, who demanded the Sunday school for children from a Muslim background be shut down permanently. Unfortunately, the local authorities sided with the demands and the Sunday school is now looking for another location to gather.

The local Sunday school leader, a woman convert from Islam, has found the experience very difficult and has asked those who are involved with the Open Doors prayer network to pray for the safety and faith journey of the children as they look for another place to meet. She also asks if our local Sunday school would pray for the children who used to meet in her



Sunday school that they will soon be able to do so again.





CREATIVE GROUP

Do join our group of local knitters, natterers, water colouring, stitching, card making, drawing, felting and doodling artists as they meet each Thursday afternoon in the chapel vestry. Bring your own creative project and enjoy the company of others – and a cuppa halfway through!

Fun and playful 'Sunday School' at 10am normally on the 2nd and last Sundays of the month. All children welcome to join us.

We want things to be fun, engaging, and practical, so we colour in, sing, act, create things and sometimes go outside. We really hope your child or grandchild would want to join us. We currently have 3-4 children joining our small group and we really want more friends!

The next dates are: 5th May, 26th May and 9th June at 10am in the chapel – come in through the vestry door.

5th May: Music is one way we can express our joy and thanks to God. Do you play an instrument? Our hearts are a sort of instrument too. God plays a tune on the strings of our hearts, called "love". What does it sound like?

26th **May:** It has just been Pentecost, a day of celebration that the Holy Spirit came to help all those who follow Jesus. Today, we look at a strange conversation that took place in the middle of the night because someone had some important questions to ask Jesus.

9th **June:** Jesus says that all those who believe in him can be part of his family. What a huge big family that is! Maybe we will do a family tree together – maybe we can do one for the church, too?

If you know of a primary school aged child who would like to come, please bring them along so they can see whether they like it. Children need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.

God says to us: "Don't panic. I'm with you. There's no need to fear for I'm your God. I'll give you strength. I'll help you. I'll hold you steady, keep a firm grip on you."
